Yom HaShoah: Holocaust Remembrance Day Program to be held at our Temple

Yom HaShoah is observed on the 27th day of the month of Nisan in the Hebrew calendar, which begins in the evening of Wednesday, April 23rd and continues on the day of Thursday, April 24th. We will commemorate the Holocaust with a Yom HaShoah Remembrance Day program on Thursday afternoon, April 24th at 3 PM.

Our guest speaker will be our own Nancy Urbach, who will tell the story of how her grandfather in Nashville Tennessee saved numerous relatives and neighbors from Germany. We will also hear from members of our Temple whose parents were Holocaust Survivors or refugees from the Nazis.

We will invite neighboring congregations to come together with us and have a number of ministers offer short Reflections and prayers.

Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day, is a day to commemorate the six million Jewish people who were systematically murdered by the Nazis during the Holocaust. It is a day to remember the victims, honor the few remaining survivors, and reflect on the lessons of the Holocaust.

The Nazis were trying to murder every single Jew in the entire world. This attempt to destroy the entire Jewish people is termed an attempted genocide. The Holocaust was a genocide in which Nazi Germany, aided by local collaborators, systematically murdered approximately six million European Jews, around two-thirds of the Jewish population of Europe, between 1941 and 1945.

The word "genocide" did not exist prior to World War II. It is a specific term coined in 1942 by Polish-Jewish lawyer Raphael Lemkin and first used in print in his 1944 book, Axis Rule in Occupied Europe. Unfortunately, anti-semites and haters of the state of Israel today use the term against us, accusing the Jews and the Israelis of attempting genocide against the Palestinians. This is patently false and absurd but it nevertheless is repeated repeatedly in the news media. This creates the impression that there may actually be some basis to this accusation when in reality there is none.

In the case of the Nazis, unfortunately, there was a conscious and deliberate effort to try to murder every single Jewish man woman and child that they could get their hands on. The Holocaust was the culmination of a long history of antisemitism in Europe. The Nazis took this persecution to a new level of brutality. Jews were stripped of their citizenship and their property and forced to live in ghettos. Many in Western Europe were sent to concentration camps. in Eastern Europe, the Eisengroupen shot More than a million Jews and buried them in mass graves. Extermination centers were built where millions more were gassed upon arrival and their bodies were burned.

After World War II ended and the Holocaust was stopped, we spoke about the obligation of preventing any other antisemitic group from butchering Jews. "Never again," we said. Unfortunately, after October 7th we cannot say this any longer since Hamas came over the border into Israel and murdered approximately 1200 innocent individuals for no other reason than that they were Jews or were associated with Jews.

I think many of us believed that with Holocaust Education we could teach subsequent generations that hating Jews was irrational and should be condemned. Unfortunately, we have seen in the past year and a half the proliferation of irrational hatred of Jews and Israel, the homeland of the Jews. As a result of what we have seen recently, it's much harder to believe that we could ever eradicate anti-semitism. Nevertheless, the commemoration of Yom HaShoah can still serve as an important educational vehicle.



NOTES FROM OUR CANTOR

During this month we will observe two distinctly different kinds of important holidays in our yearly cycle. Passover not only contains the emotions of oppression, despair, and fear, but also those of joy, freedom, and hope. Yom Hashoa, on the other hand, is very much centered on


remembering the horror of the genocide and observing the yartzeits of six million Jews. Music for both these events reflects their various moods. Pesach songs lead us personally through the Haggadah's story from one of suffering to another of awesome wonder and gratefulness --- all in less time than the movie, "The Ten Commandments." Contrarily, Holocaust music is somber and soul wrenching. Without appropriate melodies to express these historic dramas, the seder and the service would be like movies without matching musical soundtracks, i.e. "Star Wars" or "Shindler's List" ---with scores reversed. (Incidentally, as diverse as they are, both those scores were composed by John Williams.)

Has there been a movie where a typical Jewish family, let's say in Atlanta in 1859, is having their seder, reading of Jews as slaves, all the while being served by slaves of their own? That would be nothing to sing about. I imagine they tried not to connect the dots. But we can and do in the song, "Avadim Hayinu," which translates thusly: "We were slaves to Pharaoh in Egypt, and God freed us from Egypt with a might hand. Had not the Holy One, praised be Adonai, delivered our people from Egypt, then we, our children, and our children's children would still be enslaved." Now, truly, that is something to sing about. Also, "Go Down, Moses," an African American spiritual, is often included in many seders even though it does mention Moses, whose name is not mentioned at all in the Haggadah.

Elijah's Cup, placed in the center of the table and filled either before the seder or before the singing of "Eiliyahu Hanovi," is symbolic of the coming of the Messianic Age. Unlike affable Santa Claus, who brings presents and receives milk, The Prophet, according to folk legends and magical tales, is said to be wandering the Earth in the disguise of a beggar, monitoring our treatment of the poor and disadvantaged. Oh, yes, and he receives wine in his cup paced next to Miriam's Cup, which is filled with water. This relatively new tradition serves to remember Miriam's Well, the source of water for the Israelites in the desert. It was considered a magical well as it is said to have followed them for forty years because of the merits of Miriam. Its waters were also said to be healing and sustaining. "And Miriam, the prophet, took the timbral in her hand..." thus begins both Exodus 15:20 and Debbie Friedman's "Miriam's Song."

When the Israelites, suddenly former slaves, reached the other side of the Sea of Reeds, they sang, "Mi Chamocha," now sung every Shabbat to praise our God. May we never stop reliving, in undaunted spirit, the joy of freedom. May our woeful tunes be replaced by happy tunes. May we never forget the bravery and steadfastness of our forebearers, and may each holiday renew our faith and our lives as we sing, as one people, to God.



Holocaust Remembrance Day Yom HaShoah Program, April 24th

Temple Beth Shalom of the West Valley's Holocaust Remembrance Day (Yom HaShoah) program will be from 3-4:30 p.m. April 24 at the Temple, 12202 N. 101st Ave. in Sun City. Members of the public are invited to attend this solemn program.

Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day, is observed as Israel's day of commemoration of the 6 million Jews murdered in the Holocaust by Nazi Germany and its collaborators, and for the Jewish resistance in that period.

Featured speaker will be Nancy Urbach, whose grandfather went to Germany and rescued 200 relatives and friends from the Nazis. In addition, four members of the TBS congregation whose parents were Holocaust survivors will speak briefly. West Valley ministers and rabbis also will offer prayers and statements.



Ancient Jewish & Christian BIBLICAL INTERPRETATION

MONDAYS • APRIL 7, 14 AND 21, 2025 • 10 - 11:30 AM

This is a classic course that Rabbi Kaplan has taught throughout his career about how Jews interpreted the Bible before the development of rabbinic Judaism.

Using sources put together and translated by professor James Kugel of Harvard University, we'll look at how different commentators from different parts of the Greek and Roman worlds interpreted biblical stories in similar ways.

We're going to choose one story from the book of Genesis and then look at excerpts from different commentaries that have been saved from oblivion. Almost all of the sources that we're going to look at were not saved by us - the Jews, So it's a little bit of a miracle that we have so much of this literature.

This course will show the participants how so much of biblical knowledge was preserved over the centuries by luck and happenstance and what those works of wisdom reveal about early Jewish biblical interpretation and the influence that it had on early Christianity.

We will also look at short excerpts from various works of biblical commentaries that have been edited for relevance and readability. This course is perfect for people who have intellectual curiosity – it is not necessary to have any background in Bible or biblical interpretation of engage in this course.

We're hoping for a relatively small group of interfaith participants that can do a little bit of work preparing for each session and participate actively in an interactive setting where we all participate and contribute to the dialogue.


TREE OF LIFE




